COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This is a well-written imaging review for multimodality imaging of renal inflammatory lesions. However, there are also some problems. 1. Punctuation: In the abstract and in the part of EMPHYSEMATOUS PYELONEPHRITIS, the use of some commas are missing. Please check and correct the problem. 2. Abstract: In the last sentence in the conclusion, it seems that a word "imaging" should be added between "varied" and "spectrum" to show what spectrum of renal inflammatory lesions. 3. Keywords: Imaging modalities and Renal infection should be added to the key words because they are far more important than the current key words. 4. Introduction in the text: In this part, the authors did not describe the importance of imaging check-up in renal infection before moving onto the next part. So, the authors should describe the importance of imaging in renal infection before moving onto the next part. 5. EOSINOPHILIC CYSTITIS: In this part, the authors said that "In clinically presents with hematuria, frequency and irritative symptoms in a middle aged individual". Does this mean the eosinophilic cystitis frequently invade middle aged individuals or you just used one example in a middle aged individual? Please rephrase this sentence. It is quite confusing. 6. Conclusion: In the second sentence, "evaluation of" should be deleted because of duplication. 7. Figures 5 and 14: In figure 5, the word "as" should be "was" or "is"? In figure 14, the word "with" behind "within" should be deleted.

COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This review article is well written. Although there is nothing new, I hope this will be published. Some minor comments: 1) Acute pyelonephritis is usually diagnosed based on clinical symptoms and laboratory data without imaging examinations. In many cases of mild acute pyelonephritis, enhanced CT or ultrasonography may show no abnormal findings. These points should be added in the "acute pyelonephritis" section. 2) In figure 8, "moeity" should corrected to "moiety".
