The study presents an interesting case with a nice work up off he literature. Nevertheless an English language work up is essential. Some specific comments Core tip : Isolated subtalar dislocations are rare and typically met in combination with fractures of the adjacent bones such as malleoli, talus and calcaneus. This sentence is arbitrary - at one thing you speak about isolated dislocations and then you say that they are together with other injuries, please rephrase Herein we present a case of 36-year-old man with an isolated medial subtalar dislocation who was brought to the operating room after an unsuccessful attempt to closely reduce the dislocation. In the operating room, under general anesthesia the dislocation successfully reduced and a posterior splint was applied for 4 weeks. Why is this a core tip?? Rephrase Figures. Figure 2 still seems to have the patients ID on it! Discussion. When do you see an indication to perform an Angio CT after reduction? How high is the rate of vascular injuries, e.g. endothel lesions?
