COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This is a comprehensive review on ACL rehabilitation aspects that is interesting for the readers. However, the manuscript is quite long and some sections lack of summaries to extract partial conclusions. Besides, it is unclear what is the evidence level of most selected studies, and the derived information may not have the same interest. Although I think the review will deserve publication, I would recommend changes to the manuscript that could increase its value. In each subheading: -Try to summarize studies that focus on the same endpoints, grouping and comparing those that offer similar and dissimilar results -Differentiate studies that hold higher evidence and stress those conclusions, from others with lower evidence. -Incorporate a paragraph of partial conclusions per subheading that could help the reader to isolate current state of knowledge. Also, please review the manuscript thoroughly to solve typos and other minor language issues.
