Red, raised area of flesh



Mostly occur on the :

- Face
- Scalp
- Chest
- Neck
- Back

A non-cancerous reddish tumor formed of excess blood vessels.

Common (More than 200,000 cases per year in US)

Rarely requires lab test or imaging

Treatment from medical professional advised

Can last several months

Occurs as a result of abnormally dense group of extra blood vessels. Normally characterized as red, rubbery growth or tumor. Usually, it disappears on its own. Medications or laser surgery may be necessary in rare cases.

Symptoms

Usually does not show any symptoms:

- They appear as small red scratches or bumps
- As they grow, they look like burgundy- colored birthmarks
- Mostly occurs on the face, scalp, chest, neck or back
- Grow larger into a spongy mass, then gradually start to disappear
- They resolve on their own by age 5. It may leave a faded, faint mark
